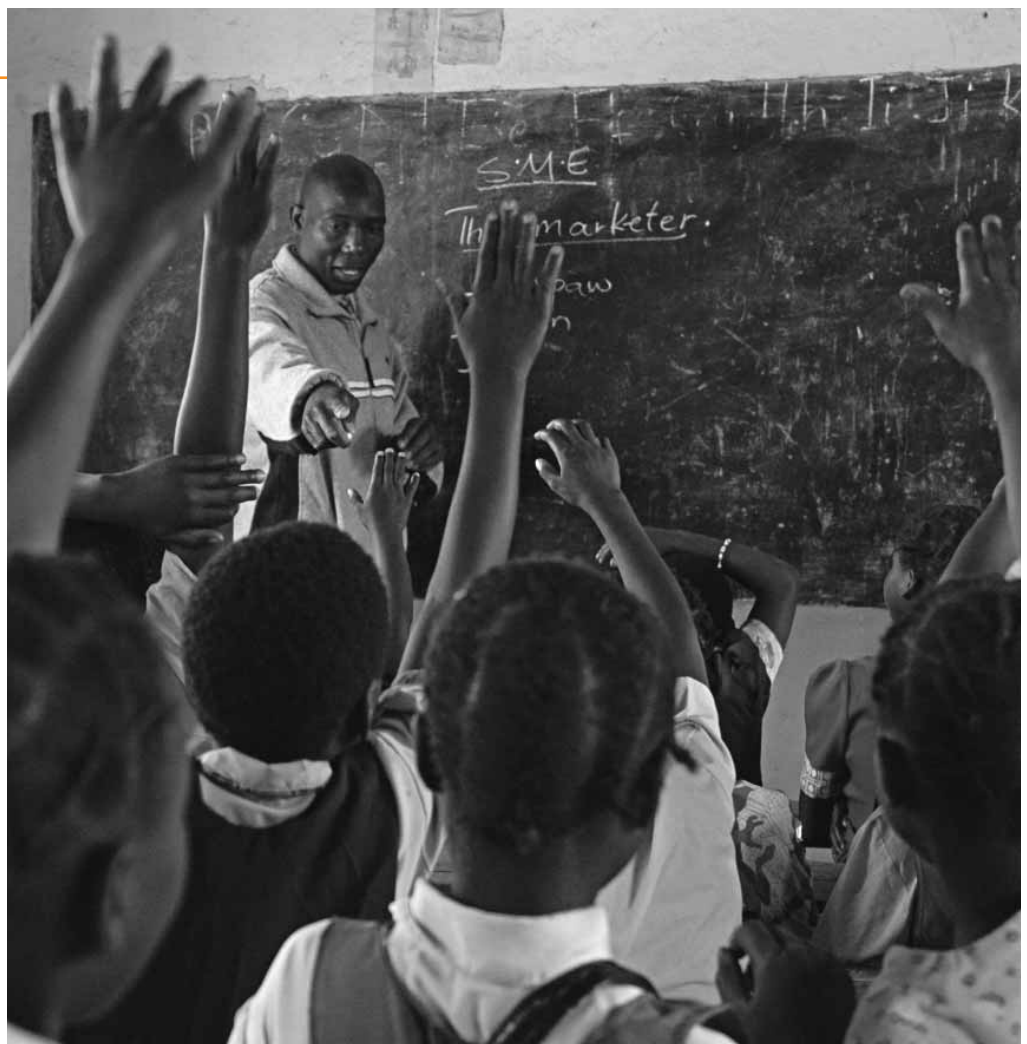
### Our Commitment
